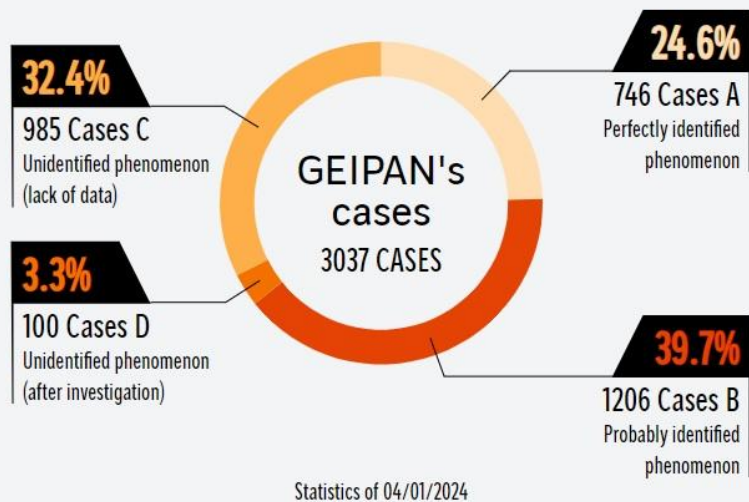

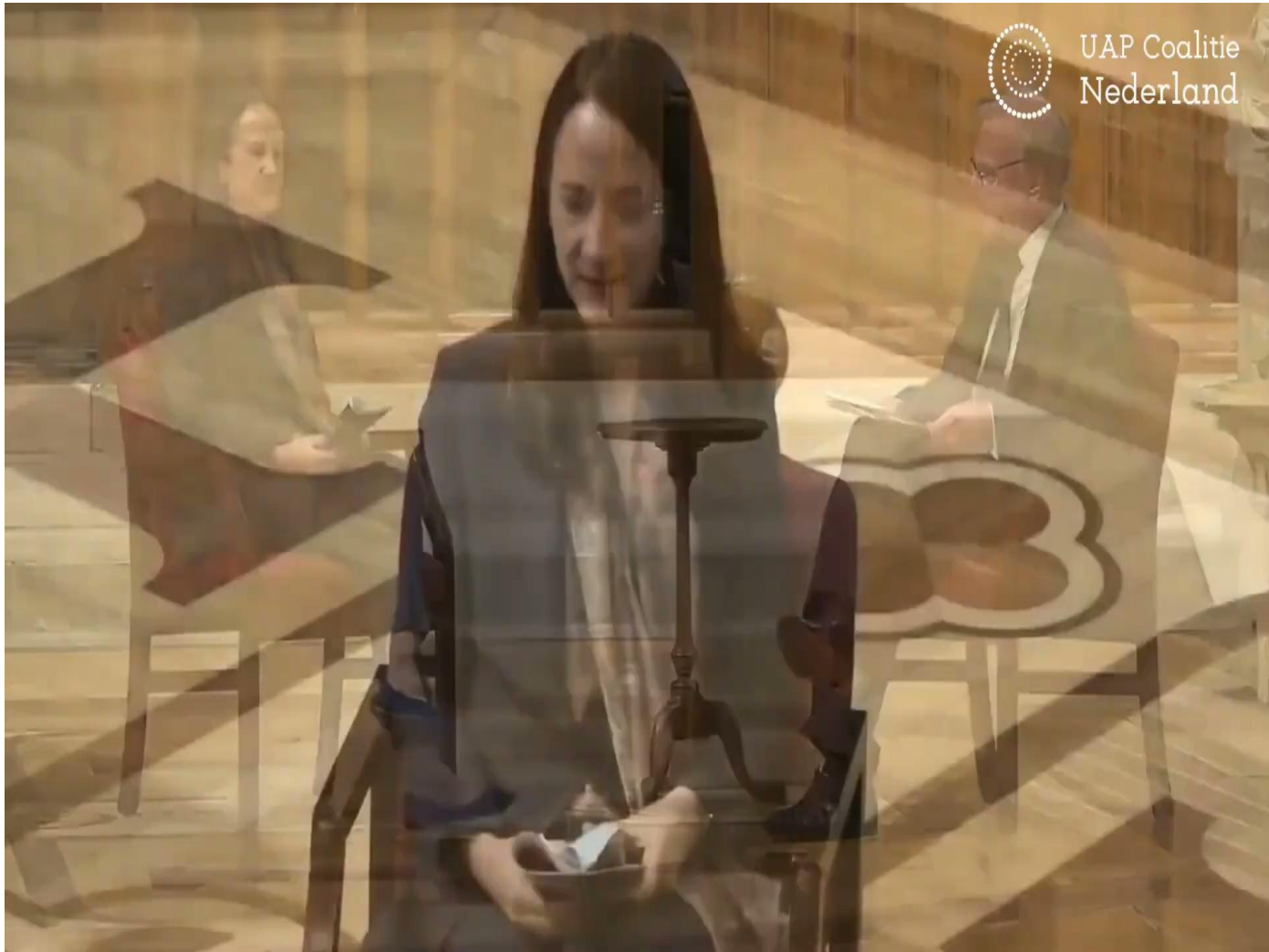

A	Perfectly identified phenomenon	24.56 %
B	Probably identified phenomenon	39.71 %
C	Unidentified phenomenon (lack of data)	32.43 %
D	Unidentified phenomenon (after investigation)	2.30 %
D1	Unidentified phenomenon (after investigation), of Medium consistency	0.99 %
D2	Unidentified phenomenon (after investigation), consistency Strong	0.00 %

Since 2016 the GEIPAN uses "dynamic" statistics. They are calculated with the data related to classified cases that are published on the website all years combined.

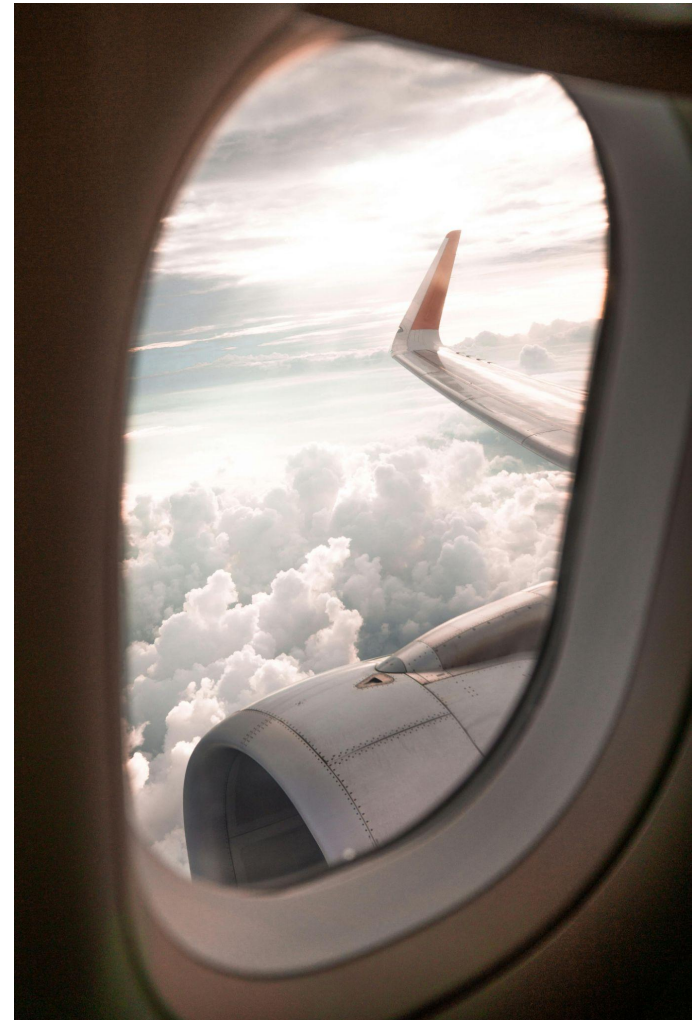
