

Position paper on Strengthening EU Defense Against UAP Threats

Introduction:

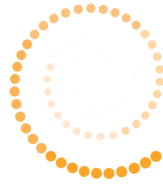
UAP Coalition Netherlands, an independent non-profit NGO, represents aviation, armed forces, and law enforcement professionals who have encountered Unidentified Anomalous Phenomena (UAP). Our mission is to promote [awareness](#), research, and improved regulations for UAP.

Background:

Unidentified Anomalous Phenomena (UAP) is anything in space and air, on land, and in the sea that cannot be identified. UAP, observed across these various domains, present significant [security](#) challenges. The United States, Russia, and China have acknowledged these [risks](#) and have taken proactive measures. The U.S. established the All-Domain Anomaly Resolution Office ([AARO](#)), with [guidelines](#) from the US Joint Chiefs of Staff, and appointed a UAP research director within [NASA](#). [China](#) leverages artificial intelligence to analyze UAP data, while [Russia](#) also actively researches UAP phenomena.

Current issues:

Despite [international](#) efforts, the EU lacks a dedicated mechanism to address UAP, in particular for UAP observed at military infrastructure (for example air force bases). This oversight compromises our ability to understand, mitigate, and respond to potential UAP threats. The absence of a structured approach to UAP reporting and research within the EU creates vulnerabilities in our (airspace) security.



Key Recommendations:


1. **Establish an UAP Unit:** Create a dedicated UAP research and response Unit within the EU to coordinate data collection, analysis, and response strategies.
2. **Enhance Security Protocols and Detection Systems:** Develop and implement comprehensive UAP detection and tracking systems, and response protocols to enhance EU airspace security. The focus should be on military installations and critical infrastructure.
3. **Promote International Cooperation:** Engage in international cooperation with UAP departments in the U.S. and other allies to share data and best practices, enhancing our collective understanding and response capabilities.
4. **Raise Awareness and Training:** Initiate awareness campaigns and training programs for military personnel to ensure they are equipped to handle UAP encounters and to report these to the relevant military authorities.
5. **Declassify non-sensitive military UAP information:** Although several EU member states have already declassified military UAP information, a common and coherent approach across all EU member states should be followed. This should be done while not jeopardizing national security concerns.

Conclusion:

Addressing the UAP issue is [crucial](#) for the EU to maintain secure airspace and protect its citizens. We urge the SEDE committee to prioritize the establishment of a dedicated UAP Unit and implement the recommended measures to enhance our security framework.
